Admissions

Reception Admissions

From September 2019, each new year group will have 60 admission places. All other year groups, currently in the school, have a Pupil Admission Number (PAN) of 57.

Gloucester County Council (GCC) manage all admission applications for NPPS. Applications must be made through the council's website using the Common Application Form. The following criteria is applied:

1. Children in public care
2. Children who have a sibling already attending the school (at the time of admittance)
3. Children with the strongest geographical claim.

The county council manage all appeals should a place be requested but not offered during the initial application process.

In year applications

Although GCC manage all applications, we advise any in-year admission queries be raised with the school first. By doing this, we can share information about the availability of places in a particular year group before the application process is started.

We hold a waiting list for year groups that do not have any available places. Should a place become available, priority is given to those who have a sibling already in the school and, after that, to the strongest geographical

Ofsted Inspection

Ofsted inspected our school on the 11th June 2013. We are delighted that all judgements for the five areas were graded as outstanding.

They said:

- High-quality teaching inspires, motivates and challenges all pupils
- Pupils are unfailingly enthusiastic, polite and extremely well behaved. They are inquisitive and exceedingly keen to learn.

Since Ofsted last visited, we have continued to move forwards. Everyday, we aim to provide an outstanding education for our pupils. We have, since then, continued to develop our outdoor learning environment, which was the one area for development that Ofsted identified in their report. We have developed three outdoor classrooms, an allotment, created quiet outdoor areas for children to use, extended our Trim Track and found ways to further utilise the front garden, Pilley Bridge, Naunton Park and the Rose Garden.

About our school

Naunton Park Primary School is a two-form entry primary school in the heart of Cheltenham.

We are often described as a large school that has a small-school feel.

Here, we are blessed with a vast premises, which is full of open spaces, additional work areas and outdoor classrooms in addition to the usual classrooms, halls and canteen. Having two separate halls, with FS and KS1 around one and KS2 around the other, means that children feel comfortable and secure within their phase while being part of a larger community at the same time.

We are incredibly proud of our historical building and traditional environment: we maximise opportunities to celebrate our school's history. We feel that by doing this, children develop a sense of belonging in the school, in their community and in their locality's history. They certainly love hearing about and seeing pictures of the school during the war.

School Council

We love to give our pupils a voice. This is done on a day-to-day basis, but in a more formal context, our 14 School Councillors have a regular say in the running of the school. Over the past two-years, School Council have helped design the KS2 library and playground Quiet Area, they have helped to organise our Children in Need fundraising, have had a say in how PTA donations should be spent and, more recently, organised an incredibly successful Pop Up Market Day that involved the whole school.



Wrap around care

Established over twenty years ago to provide wrap round care for children attending Naunton Park Primary School, the Out of School Care Club offers a safe, caring and fun environment for children to stay and play.

The recent transfer of ownership to the school offers an exciting opportunity for the future development of the club, while the opportunities for the children to access a range of play types remains unchanged. The array of opportunities extends from indoor creative, imaginative and role-play utilising a variety of materials both natural and man-made, to outside physical pursuits on bikes and trikes and with balls of all shapes and sizes!

Children benefit from a wealth of resources and an abundance of indoor and outside space. For the Reception children, staff carefully plan a range of exciting play opportunities to further extend their learning and provide opportunities for practicing their social skills. Additionally, the club operates a key-worker system for the younger children and an annual report is shared with the Reception Class teachers.

Children attending the morning breakfast session, starting at 7.45 am, are provided with a choice of cereals, juices and toast, plus a variety of continental style breakfast options to set them up for their learning and play. At the end of the school day, children are given a light tea at 3.15 with on-toast options, fruit, vegetables, sandwiches and snacks to see them through to the close of club at 5.45pm.

Special diets are always accommodated as required.

The club staff understand the busy lifestyles of parents and children in the 21st Century and every effort is made to accommodate last minute changes to requirements. Payment is made weekly through Parent Pay or

Childcare Vouchers and is only for the hours attended.

The 6 permanent team members are long-serving, dedicated, professional and caring and an additional 2 supply staff compliments this team to effectively provide a place where children look forward to staying and playing.
