SOLUTION TO LAST TIME:

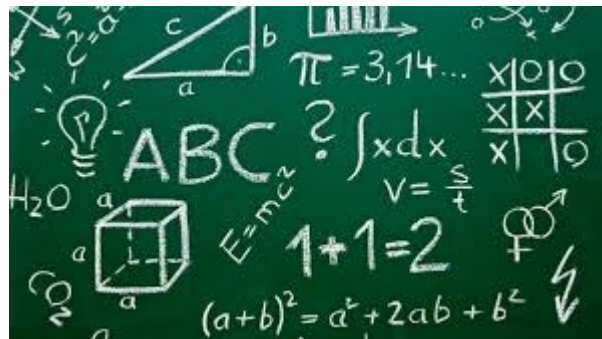
Louis and Eimear have been collecting football stickers. Between them they have 75 stickers. Eimear has eleven more than Louis. How many stickers does Louis have? How many does Eimear have?

$75 - 11 = 64$ . Halve the 64 to get the stickers Louis has: 32. Add the 11 for Eimear so she has 43.

## Vomiting and Diarrhoea

From time to time, children sadly become sick. Unfortunately, it is not always possible to distinguish between the causes, and therefore it is essential that the same rule of exclusion applies in all cases of vomiting or diarrhoea.

Both of these commonly affect children and staff, and can be caused by a number of different germs, including viruses, parasites and bacteria. Infections can be easily spread from person to person, especially in children. It is important that staff and children with diarrhoea or vomiting symptoms must **stay away** from school until 48 hours **after their last bout of being unwell**.

If your child is sick at school, we will ask you or your emergency contact to take your child home, and follow the 48 hour rule. We appreciate that this is inconvenient in many cases, but it is important that we reduce the risk of infection for all children in school. As an example, if your child is sick at lunchtime on a Tuesday, they should not return to school until after lunch on Thursday, provided there have not been any further episodes of vomiting and/or diarrhoea. Thank you for your understanding with this.

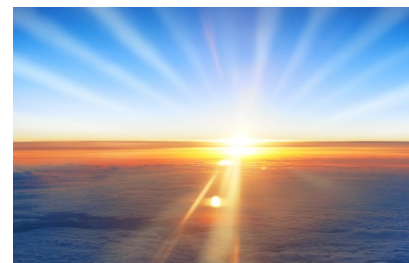

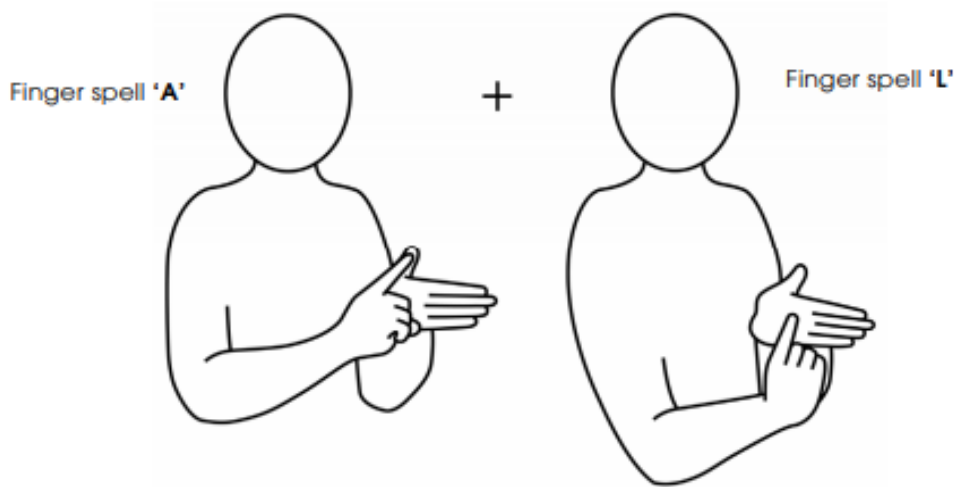
