Arts Week

Arts Week happens every year and is an opportunity to not only make 2 and 3D artwork, but also includes drama, dance and music. The staff have already started to plan exciting activities for the children to complete as part of their school week.

This years theme is 'Print'. Such a broad theme that staff have taken a particular focus on. Your child may therefore learn and practise their printing skills will rollers and ink, it may also include thumbs/fingers and paints, or taking photos; creation of own mono prints using found materials (cardboard, leaves, string, buttons, potato) etc; or looking at fonts used to tell stories, create interesting visual poetry, making posters; making prints on clay, paper or material. The list goes on.

The theme last year was 'reduce, reuse, recycle'. We would like to continue in that vain, as much as we can, reusing materials that are available at home and school rather than just buying new. You and your child(ren) may be asked to provide materials that are readily available to support and contribute to their final pieces that are being constructed at school. Be prepared for messages and requests from staff. I would also like to invite parents, friends, family to offer their help during that week, whether you are artistic or just like the opportunity to work alongside your child's class or year group. Please check with your child's teacher.

Finally a request from Reception (Red and Green) staff - could the children make collections of anything blue, green, white or clear. It could be packaging, pages from magazines, lids, paper, shiny paper, wrapping paper, bubble wrap etc. Please send into school on Monday 20 May with child for use by the whole year group to create a sea scape. Also make a selection from a huge variety of fonts from newspapers, magazines, comics, logos - the letters that make your child's name. Please send these into school as separate letters in an envelope. Many thanks.

E-safety—Live Streaming

Livestreaming is becoming a very popular way for people to broadcast themselves on apps and sites such as Instagram Live, Facebook Live, Periscope, Twitch and YouTube Live. People use these services to broadcast live video footage to others, such as their friends, a certain group of people or the general public. On some services this footage is also recorded and available to view after the livestream has ended. Discussion and involvement with your child's online life is key. Find out how they are engaging with livestreaming - always start with the positives before talking about the risks involved. Why not use one of the conversation starters below?

Do your friends livestream?	Is it something which appeals to you?
Are you aware of the risks of hosting livestreams?	Would you ever include personal information in a livestream?
Do you know what to do if something happens online which worries or upsets you?	
Are you using privacy settings to stay safe?	

It may be that you decide your child is too young to be watching or hosting livestreams – make sure they know why this is and then together agree when you can review this decision. If your child is already a fan of livestreaming you might want to set guidelines on when and where they can do it. You could agree that they can livestream only from a set room in the house, such as the living room and always with the door open. You might agree that an adult must always be present or forewarn them that you will check in at regular intervals throughout their stream. Make sure your child knows they can and should come to you about anything worrying online.

E-safety—Roblox

Roblox is a gaming platform where multiple players interact and play together online. The site has a collection of games aimed at 8-18 year olds, however players of all ages can use the site. Roblox is currently available on PC, phone, tablet and Xbox One. **Key things for parents to be aware of**

1. Communication: how users can communicate with others

Whilst the games are aimed at 8-18 year olds, there are no age restrictions. This means both adults and young people can play and communicate with each other on the platform. All games are multiplayer and include a written chat feature, which is visible to players within each individual game. Users can also make and receive friend requests during gameplay and this means that they can chat to each other outside of the game. 2. Content: what content is available that might not be suitable for children

The Roblox Studio is a section where players use their imagination and skills to create their own games and share these with others. The ability to create and play games can be very appealing to young people who like to create the content they see online. However, because content is user-generated it can mean that some games might not be appropriate for young children. For example, whilst the graphics are not very life like, some of the games feature weapons and blood.

3. Costs: How children might accidentally run up costs

By creating games, users can earn Robux, the in-game currency. You can also buy Robux in the game. Players can spend money on items, such as membership to the Builders Club. If game creators attract players and in-game adverts, they can earn a lot of Robux, which they can convert into real money. To do this, players must be over the age of 13, have paid for Roblox's premium subscription, and have access to a Paypal account. This means that younger players would need to talk to an adult to be able to exchange their Robux for real money.

Strut your stuff in a summer shirt :)

Gloucestershire Bundles are a charity set up to help children and families throughout Gloucestershire in times of crisis. And the statistics on poverty are shocking—in a class of 30 school aged children, on average 9 will be living in poverty.

Gloucestershire Bundles is made up of a small team of volunteers who make it their aim to change those figures on poverty and make a difference to those experiencing it.

The non-uniform day on 21st June is part of a big fundraising projects to raise vital funds to go towards moving to a bigger premises and to start employing staff.




Second hand uniform sale


