Dear Families.

Every Friday now, one child is chosen for going above and beyond in an aspect of school life and in recognition of that they have a Hot Choloate with me! It is a lovely way to end the week and a wonderful way for me to get to know the children.

This week I have continued with observations across the school where I have seen some wonderful learning taking place. Forest school is always a popular lesson with our children and they have been keen to share the things they have been making and building. I had the pleasure of working with some Y1 children as they wrote their own versions of Peace at Last while other children were busy in continuous provision with construction kits and fine motor skill work. Y4's had a great, but cold, day at Crickley Hill on Thursday: photographs are within the newsletter. Clubs have all started and it has been great to see the children engaging in a variety of sports from football to Strictly Come Dancing as well as music through Young Voices!

Wednesday evening, I met with over 50 parents form Y2 and Y3. I am finding these meetings useful and in conjunction with the consultation papers it will give a good perspective of the school from a parent's point of view. As I have previously mentioned, when I have finished the last meeting next week, I will record myself on teams and send this out to parents who could not make it. Consultation papers will follow each meeting.

We had a good and productive staff meeting with Pie Corbett this week on Talk for Writing—it is always good to surround ourselves by experts and continue to upskill our team and further develop expertise.

A meeting was held with GCC on Thursday morning in which we were updated on the works happening in phase one. This newsletter does contain an update form GCC which will continue every fortnight.

As mentioned in the last newsletter, we will be starting a new safety word approach for when other adults collect children. The administration of this is very time consuming and with depleted office staff at the moment Mrs Hudson will be completing this task, issuing safety words a year group at a time. An email will be sent to you when it is your class' week. Please bear with us whilst we get this new system in place – these things take time!

Further to our last update issued to you all on Friday 9th September, Phase One works are continuing to progress in the Thames and Wye classrooms, accessible and staff/visitor toilets, Head's office, reception area and former cloakroom next to the Thames classroom.

We had advised on September 9th that the Phase One works were scheduled to complete at the end of November but this has slipped slightly with works expected to complete by the end of December 2022.

We are working with the school and are continuing to develop and discuss the remaining details and duration of the full programme of phased works, the detail of which we will share with you in the coming weeks.




Wye at Crickley Hill Experience


Together we can!
