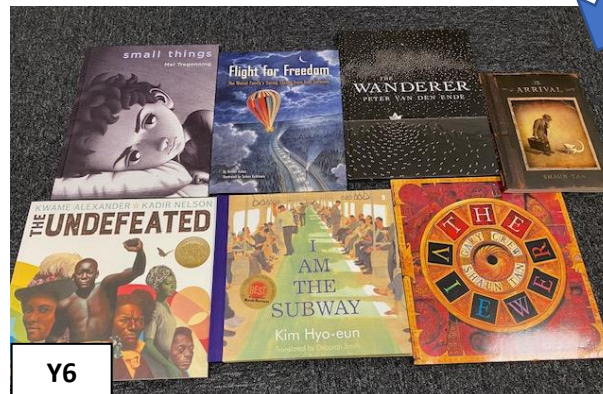

After the Fall by Dan Santat, a book about trauma and recovery

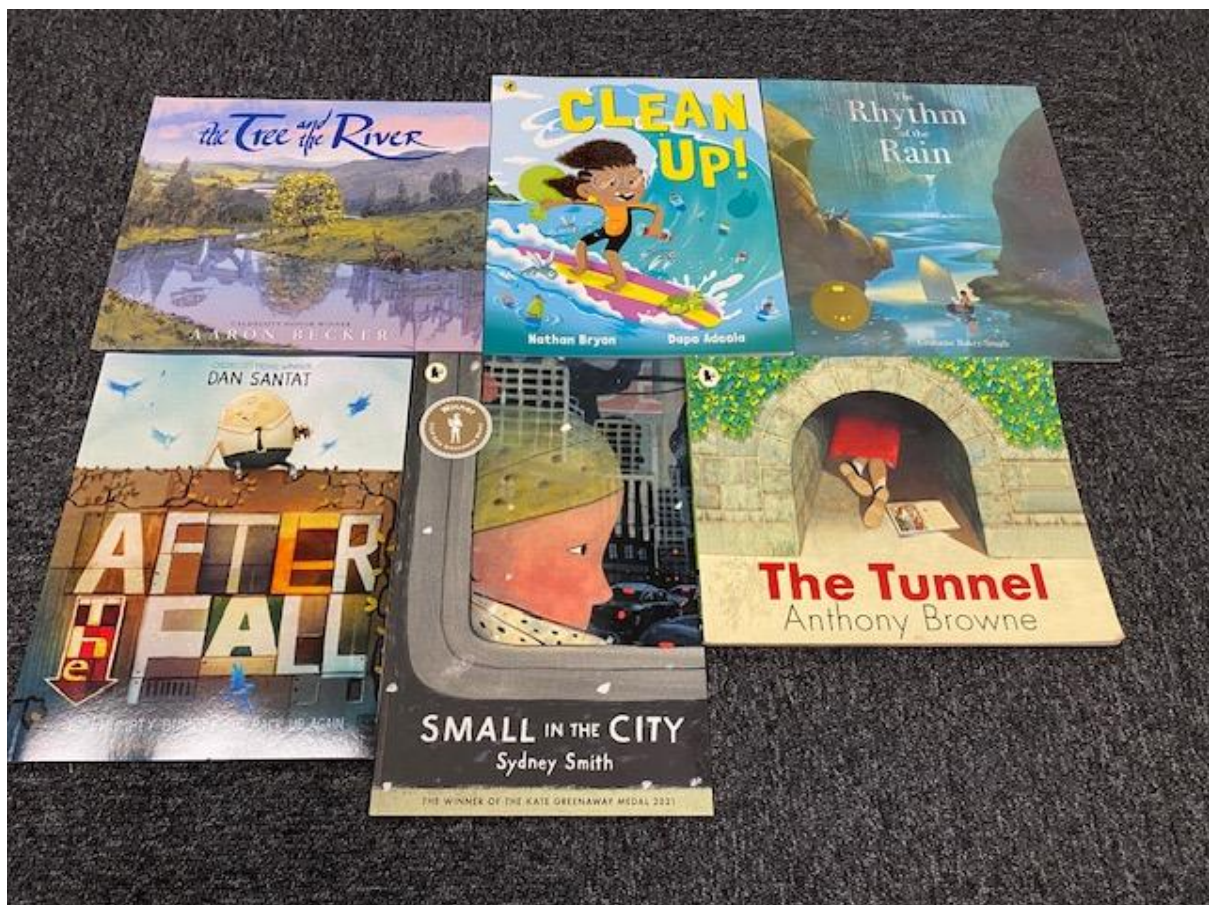
Small in the City by Sydney Smith, a wonderful picture book
