
Together we can!

BLUE CLASS - In science, we have been exploring animals and their habitats. For the main task, the children had 9 habitats and 30 animals to sort. It provoked some excellent discussion among the children, as they gave reasons for their ideas. Some animals could go in multiple habitats, which really encouraged the children to challenge their thinking! It was a valuable lesson in teamwork, cooperation and being able to listen to and appreciate other viewpoints.





Year 4 - This week in our maths lessons Thames have been learning their 6 x table and 9 x table. The children have really enjoyed being the teacher as you can see from the photos, and look very relaxed and natural being at the interactive whiteboard. This has given them the opportunity to explain any patterns they have spotted, demonstrate their answers and reasoned about their answers.



Last week Frome visited the marvellous Skill Zone in Gloucester and picked up lots of life skills to keep them safe as they grow older. They probably enjoyed being in the jail cell a little too much!





Green Class - This week we have been playing a number game on the interactive whiteboard. Mr Fox steals the numbers from a number line and we have to tell Mrs Farrow which numbers are missing and how we know. Green Class are getting good at this game.





In Cherwell Class, we have been busy learning our 3, 4 and 8 times tables. It's been great to hear the children sharing their thoughts and ideas on how to remember all their facts and making links between different times tables. We have been doing a lot of 'If I know this fact then I also know...' and 'If you buy one, you get three facts for free'.




