We are in urgent need of someone to help distribute letters to local businesses (Bath Road and the Suffolks) and then collect any donations in prior to the fair.



Then, we chose our materials to make our bridge in groups, choosing from: Lego, Unifix blocks, Art straws and Construction straws and created our designs and then began to build.

Finally, we tested our bridges to see if they would be suitable for the task.

This week Thames have mummified tomatoes! This ties in with our Egyptian topic and we look forward to watching the mummification process taking place right in front of our eyes in our classroom. We scooped out the insides delicately, wiped and sanitised the tomato thoroughly... we think we did a pretty good job that would make the Ancient Egyptians proud! The class are keen to observe their progress. We have also been creating and sculpting beautiful clay scarab beetles which have hopefully crawled home for half term!








Orange class, as part of our Science topic, have been exploring our senses and we went on a fabulous Autumn walk using these!
