

Dear Families

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This week we have made significant progress in terms of planning the next phases of building works. A meeting was held on Wednesday where a proposed plan was developed for the renovations of all remaining classrooms, toilets and corridors. This plan has been devised with most of the works happening in school holidays to reduce disruption to our children's learning. The plans will now be drawn up and reprographics made to share with you in an evening meeting, delivered by GCC. A date will be shared with you as soon as possible.

Year 4 classes will move into their classrooms after half term now, due to delays in decoration and delivery of new furniture. We are delighted with the new classrooms and although this hasn't been the easiest of projects the finished rooms are of a high quality. They are going to be a beautiful space to work and learn in – lucky Y4s!







Yesterday I shared the feedback from the consultation period, there is some very important information within this document and I encourage you all to read it. A further Curriculum Evening Meeting will be held on Wednesday 1st February at 6:30pm and you will have received a PowerPoint presentation with notes as an attachment to this newsletter. I hope you find it useful, however, it will make much more sense as part of the evening meeting. Children will be able to attend a creche in the lower hall to ensure as many parents as possible can attend.

It has been lovely dipping into the children's learning this week and seeing the new curriculum in action. Lots of geography skills and knowledge being developed though a variety of map work. We have also introduced "never heard the word" sheets at the beginning of every piece of learning which is a great way of pre-teaching vocabulary and eliciting what children know and understand. This is a strategy from Pie Corbett which he uses at the start of reading a new book but we are adopting it for all foundation subjects – it is proving to be very successful.


Class News



This week, Year 5 have been using maps and atlases to find out about the world's biomes, including their location, size and proximity to the equator or the poles.




'This week in Year 4 PSHE we have been discussing our hopes and dreams for our futures. Children represented these hopes and dreams on their beautiful leaves.'

We are preparing to begin developing our character description writing skills, before we begin innovating our own version of the story with our own interesting characters. Watch this space, I think they're going to be amazing.





