Dear Families,

Another week which has absolutely flown by, filled with great learning both in and out of school as you will see from the class pictures. I began my week with assembly as usual, this week the Y6 children have been asking about the return of snack shack and if this can bee achieved. They have asked children and about 60% said they would like it. I have asked the Y6 children to write to parents and gauge their feelings about this.

I spent a lovely morning teaching in Red class where I did some story-time with them and a sounds-write lesson. I was very impressed with their segmenting and blending, and how they are engaged with their learning.

With the introduction of the new curriculum I am spending a lot of time with subject leads mapping out learning across the pieces of learning and across the whole year. Working with the English team this week we have now mapped out every year group and what their fiction and non-fiction will be for the whole year. We have also completed all learning for the next piece after Easter, which will have a strong history focus. Now we have the lovely part of buying new books to support this learning and planning some great trips and experiences.

Strike Action

As you may be aware the NEU is preparing to strike on 1st February. I fully support the strike action and any teacher who wishes to do so. This is not just about a pay rise – which is fully required but also about how the pay rise this time has come from our school budget. Our school has incurred an extra debt of £60 000 because of this. Imagine what that could have been spent on! I will share more information when I know who is striking and not – teachers have no obligation to share this with me, but some have. We will either have a partial or full closing – support staff will not be used to cover classes. I know this strike will divide people, in thoughts and opinions, that is beyond my control. I am a member of the NEU, as a leader, and as a teacher. Information will be shared as soon as possible.






Class News
