The Back on Track model has ensured greater consistency across the school in teaching core subjects and other curriculum areas. We continue to ensure that safeguarding is at the centre of everything that we do, and much work has been accomplished in this area.


Bag2School - Tues 4thJuly

Safe Adults

All adults that enter our school site are safe to be here thanks to our rigorous checks. The children in school know what our different coloured lanyards mean and are encouraged to check the lanyard of any adult asking to work with them, both in and out of the classroom. Safe to be supervised in school:

The ticks and crosses above are used to show children who they can/cannot be alone with in school.

Safeguarding curriculum

Our Safeguarding Curriculum map is now available to view on the school's website here: Naunton Park Primary School - Safeguarding in the curriculum Please note that we are constantly reviewing our safeguarding curriculum inline with national and local authority guidance and in response to pupils' changing needs. We are still also in the process of planning and introducing the Challenge Curriculum, so plans may change and/or be added to.

Medicines in school

If your child requires medication, we ask (where possible) that this is administered before/after school by a parent/carer. If medication must be administered during the school day, parents must bring the medicine to the school office and complete a form. All medication is kept securely in the school office. If your child attends Kids' Club, the medication and form are passed directly between the office and Kids' Club staff then returned to the parent upon pick up from Kids' Club.
