#### Dear Families,

This week has been a hive of activity as we commence our summer Term 6: and the sunshine has made all the difference. Children have been visiting the Science Festival as part of our Challenge Curriculum - Statistic. The children have loved their visits reporting back to school very positively about the talks and activities they have been involved in. Year 2 visited a local Mosque this week as part of their learning ; Mrs Chew informed me that it was a great experience where the children learnt how the Mosque operates and the Imam even let them listen to how he calls people to prayer. Our children were so inquisitive, curious and fascinated to learn about this - just what we want as part of a rich and diverse education.

This week we invited our new reception parents to school for their evening induction and we have a couple of stay and plays this term so our new children feel welcomed to our school. Thank you to our EYFS team for making this such an enjoyable experience.

Over the last two days we have been holding Teaching Partner interviews as we recruit 7 more TPs to our school. This will replace a couple who are leaving and all the others will be new additions to the team. This means more support than before at NPPS - ensuring we are improving meeting the needs of all our learners across our school. All parents will be informed of the outcomes of this in due process. We are presently recruiting a new PPA/Forest School Teacher and a full-time Reception Class Teacher. This is why we are still waiting to share the new staffing plan with the team and then you as families. Children will be informed as soon as possible with dates to be arranged for meeting their new teachers for the new academic year.

We had some very positive feedback from our OPAL play external mentor:

Mrs Turner, Miss Barraclough and Mrs Martin met with Rachel Murray who is our OPAL mentor. She has been supporting us since the start of the initiative and the last time she visited we had the generator on the playground and were expecting temporary classrooms any moment!! Remember that?! So, at that time, we were unsure what was going to happen with OPAL. Therefore, Rachel wasn't sure what to expect on her visit today.

Rachel spent nearly an hour on the playground at lunch time and came back in beaming, saying she couldn't stop smiling! She shared her glowing feedback and was really pleased with our progress. She said the atmosphere on the playground is completely different to when she first visited, the children are being far more creative in their play, there are more mixed genders and ages playing together and said the space is working really well, especially as we have a tricky outdoor space to work with (long and narrow and nearly all hard surface).

# Safeguarding

#### **Visiting School**

We love welcoming visitors to school – we love to share our work with others, the children love to meet new people and we love to learn from others too. Parent helpers provide additional opportunities for children to read aloud and be able to go on trips safely.

#### **Arriving at school**

To keep everyone safe, we ALWAYS ensure that the visitors coming onto our school site are safe to be here and that they are 'suitable' adults to be working with our children.

To accomplish this, we ask all visitors (including parents) to:

- Sign in at the office if the fire drill goes off, the office staff will check you're safe
- Provide ID we need to make sure you are who you say you are (even if you know someone!)
- Read our Visitors' Leaflet that you'll be given and the posters in the office area
- Wear a lanyard while on the premises green if you share a DBS and red if you don't
- Remain with a member of staff if you are wearing a red lanyard.

These procedures may seem exhaustive sometimes, but please know that we are doing it to keep the children (and you) safe while you're in school.

#### Working with children

We ask that any visitor to the school (including when helping on school trips):

- Does not use their personal device when in the company of children
- Does not take photographs unless on a school-owned device and on request of the teacher
- Reports any concern of a child's wellbeing or behaviour to a member of school staff immediately
- Does not administer first aid please call on a member of staff
- Activates the fire alarm (red boxes around the school) in the case of a fire or necessary evacuation
- Reads the Child Protection procedures listed in the Visitors Leaflet and displayed around school
- Speaks to the headteacher immediately if they have a concern about a member of staff

#### **Helping on trips**

We could not arrange trips without our wonderful parent helpers! Again, however, we have strict procedures to follow in order to keep everyone safe;

- Please wear a hi-vis jacket (provided by the office staff) children can spot you easily!
- Please keep your green/red lanyard on for the duration of the trip
- Please provide the office staff with ID (even if you're just helping for an hour)
- Please sign in upon arrival and sign out when you leave with the children (in case of a fire drill)

#### Leaving school

At the end of a visit, we ask all visitors to sign out at the school office and return their lanyard. If you have a child to collect from the playground and it's the end of the day, please still leave via the office and walk around to the playground. This ensures that we've taken you off our fire register for the day and that we have all the lanyards back. It's essential that we know who is on the site at any given time of the day.

#### **Exceptions!**

There are some exceptions to the above! If you are coming into school to watch a performance, for Open Classrooms or for Sports Day (for example) we may not ask you to sign in or wear a lanyard. However, please still adhere to our rules about the use of personal devices, please do not take any photos, please report any concern to a member of staff immediately and please ensure you only go to the relevant areas of the school for that activity.
