Class News

In Blue Class we have been exploring the question, 'Who is Muslim and how do they live?' As part of this exploration, we have been learning about the words 'sacred' and 'holy' and what this actually means. We know that The Qur'an is a sacred text for Muslims and we have found out how Muslims show respect towards it. Last week, the children (in small groups) discussed and ordered the ways Muslims show respect to the Qur'an according to what they thought was the level of importance. I was incredibly proud of the explanations and justifications the children gave - they were so insightful. There was no right or wrong answer for the task, yet it really inspired the class to think carefully about their reasoning. Awesome work Blue Class!

We have been learning the wonderful story of The Very Hungry Caterpillar by Eric Carle this week in Red Class. We created an amazing story map as a class which was a mixture of pictures we drew, images and photos of our Talk for Writing actions. We even drew small caterpillars which can travel around the map. We were fascinated by the methods that Eric Carle used to create his illustrations and asked to make some ourselves in the same way. So we created large pieces of painted paper which were textured in different ways and will cut these up next week to create our own pictures. We can't wait!



On Thursday, Year 6 were invited to Cheltenham College to take part in a Science Spectacular. We did physics workshops - where we observed the effects of electricity and used prisms and mirrors to change the direction of light. We also did a chemistry workshop where we burnt differential chemicals to create phosphorescent light. Safeguarding

Playtimes

As parents are aware, we have invested a lot of time and resources into improving our playtime provision for the children at Naunton Park in recent years. We have seen a huge improvement to the amount of play that is happening as a result of the resources donated/purchased for the school (thank you) and children now have longer to play with their friends thanks to our outdoor eating areas and new routines.

To further improve playtimes, Miss Hudson has been talking to the children in assemblies about how they can keep themselves and others safe on the playground. A summary of some of the discussion points can be viewed below. Please take some time to discuss these with your child, to further highlight their personal responsibility to help keep themselves and others safe.

Equipment







All children are taught and reminded to:

- Stack no more than three tyres (or up to waist height)
- Put all toys and equipment away at the end of playtime Store things neatly
- Carry long objects so that they point downwards

Timetables

There are children in every year group who enjoy playing on the trim track of basketball court. We have timetables so that there aren't too many children at any one time and so that children can enjoy the spaces with their friends and similar aged children. All children are expected to stick to the timetables and can ask any adult when it's their turn to avoid confusion.





Food and drink



Children are taught that one way to keep ourselves safe is to fuel our bodies with healthy food and drink. Please provide your child with a health snack along with a water bottle each day.
