### Dear Families,

Whether the strikes work or not is yet to be seen, but we have to take a stand now, for the future of education in this country. Even in the news locally last night we heard from secondary teachers who have 64 children in a maths class. Parents sharing their experience of children being taught by supply teachers for two consecutive years.






### What an amazing piece of learning this has been!
