School News

This week Charlotte and Alex are Y6 Parklike News Reporters. They interviewed lots of children and spent their lunchtime in my office writing their findings up.



Hi, we are the first 2023 news reporters and we have been interviewing pupils around the school and asking them what they have been doing this week, and how they have been settling into their new classes. We hope you are enjoy our news.

In Y1 we found out that they have been learning lots of different types of dinosaurs. The question they have been working towards finding out how dinosaurs diesd out. In maths they have been doing lots of counting up to 20.

Y2 have been doing lots of times tables work, specifically 2x, and have recently done a test on it.

We learned that in Y3 they have been busy with stone age, iron age and bronze age, focusing on why and how they settled. Y4 have learned a lot about Ancient Mayans and even had one come in for them! (not an actual real one) They even did number lines on the 25x table. I can't even count that high!

Nasty Numbers! That's what Y5 have been doing. Turning numbers into letters and the opposite! They have working on suspense stories all about Boudicca and Icene Tribe.

In Y6 we have been learning all about figurative language and creating atmosphere based on a picture. Our maths we have been working with 7 digit numbers, rounding to the nearest 10,100, and 1000s. Our History we learned a lot about WW2 and doing research on Winston Churchill to put into a biography.

To round up our report, everyone is enjoying their new classes, topics and growing independence. One of the favourites amongst us is netball club, in fact so many people signed up that they have had to split the groups into two.

Class News





This week in Yellow Class we have been learning about significant people linked to the discovery of dinosaurs (Dr Robert Plot, Mary Anning, William Buckland and Richard Owen) and have had great fun making some of our own dinosaur fossils out of clay.



This week, year 6 started their new Computing topic. We learnt how to use the green screen to put our actions into a picture of a setting that we wouldn't normally be able to film in. Mrs Staniland challenged the children to imagine that they were crossing a ravine on a rickety bridge; jumping over stepping stones across a pool of lava; or balancing

on a tightrope with no safety net! We combined the video of our performance with an appropriate and background and made ourselves look like we were achieving the impossible!





This term, Year 5 are looking to answer the question, 'How have the Romans shaped the culture of Great Britain?' This week we were looking at what they did for entertainment, beginning the week by identifying where the Roman amphitheatres are within the UK and the artefacts that were found there. We have then been working on researching some of the activities that were part of their entertainment such as chariot racing, mime and gladiatorial battles. We created freeze frames and we are looking forward to sharing our findings with the class.



In Year 2 we are learning a story called The Magic Porridge Pot.

We are focusing in particular on writing descriptive language to help us to write character descriptions.

The children have had some amazing ideas and have written some lovely descriptions of their own using powerful adjectives.

More impressive however is their use of their 'everyday writer's toolkit ' where they are checking and editing their own work.

WOW! What a start to Year 2!



This week Reception Class have been exploring their new setting both inside and out!

This week the children in red and green classes have continued to explore the provision. Continuous provision enables the children to become familiar with the placement of resources in the classroom and also be able to return to them to alter and adapt what is being made.

The construction area continues to be popular with children from both groups. Mobilo vehicles that are altered throughout the day, drawn and written about. This morning we painted portraits of ourselves in the outside area.







Safeguarding

Visiting School

We're very much looking forward to welcoming family, friends and other visitors to school more often this academic year. We've planned termly Open Classroom events, Open Days for prospective parents and Class Assemblies for which parents will be invited to watch.

What should you see in school?

If you observe anything that contradicts our expectations, please speak to member of staff or, if more appropriate, the headteacher.

Like staff and pupils, we expect our visitors to have high expectations when in school. You should expect to see:

- Polite, respectful, kind and helpful staff and children.
- Children supervised at all times unless wearing a yellow band.
- Adults wearing a lanyard.
- Children working with adults wearing a blue, orange or green lanyard (NOT red).
- Posters on display that help adults and children to understand how to be safe in school.
- Children asking for help if they need it.

It's essential that all visitors follow our safeguarding procedures when coming into school. These procedures are summarised below:

Arriving at school

- Sign in at the office if the fire drill goes off, the office staff will check you're safe
- Take a look at our 4 key safeguarding posters displayed by the office hatch
- Read our Visitors' Leaflet that is available to take from the office hatch
- Wear a lanyard (or sticker for larger events) while on the premises

These procedures may seem exhaustive sometimes, but please know that we are doing it to keep the children (and you) safe while you're in school.

In school and in the presence of children

- Please do not use your personal device when in the premises
- Do not take photographs unless on a school-owned device and on request of the teacher
- Reports any concern of a child's wellbeing or behaviour to a member of school staff immediately
- Do not administer first aid please call on a member of staff
- Activate the fire alarm (red boxes around the school) in the case of a fire or necessary evacuation
- Speaks to the headteacher immediately if you have a concern about a member of staff
- Ensure you're never on your own with a child unless the office has a copy of your DBS and you're a
 registered volunteer with a green lanyard

Leaving school

- Sign out via the school office
- If you have a child to collect, sign out & walk around to the playground as per our usual collection procedure
