Dear Families,

Attached to this week's newsletter is a copy of the results from this summer's parent/carer questionnaire. Initially we only had 25% of parents who completed the form so an extension was in place for the summer holidays. Thank you to everyone who completed this, the results now reflect 50% of families at Naunton Park. This will be shared at our governors meeting and then a summary report will be written and shared with you.

Lots more exciting events for our children this week, with Y1 going in search of Dinosaurs at Birdland, Y3 travelling to Bristol Museum in search of stone age and iron age artefacts and our fabulous Avon Class hosting the first Friday Family Assembly. As you will see in the report, Y1 loved the double decker bus!!

Works have been finalised for October half term to extend our EYFS provision for better opportunities for early years play. The perimeter fence is moving 3m out and extending to the back wall (where we keep the wellies) and down to Y1 entrance. This is the first step and following that we will then need to invest in more balancing equipment, 2 sandpits and planting for a mini forest school area. More information will follow about this but it is very exciting to see improvement to our environment happening!

Healthy Lunches and Snacks

All schools must promote healthy eating and we are keen to ensure we do this. Can you please make sure lunch boxes have a balanced meal. 
Class News

This week in EYFS we have continued our Talk 4 Writing journey with the text Owl Babies. The accompanying pictures will show this journey. The story was read to the whole class by their teacher.

Then we talked about the front and back of the book. The front cover contains the title, author and illustrators name(s), and the back cover contains the blurb (we quite like that word!!) We learnt that the blurb tells enough of the story to give an idea what the story is about.

We then used our Talk 4 Write actions to help use retell the story. Our teachers created a simple 3-part map of the story to help use remember. Can your child retell the story to you using the actions?

Then we drew our own story map. Wow. Great work everyone.













Year 5 are now well into their hockey lessons and many have caught the bug!

In the first few weeks Frome has been learning how to hold the hockey stick, which is surprisingly difficult, making sure we bend our knees and stick our bottoms out as far as we can so that we don't get backache! We have also been learning how to hold the stick as we race up and down the pitch — pretending they are suitcases.

One we knew how to hold the stick, we moved on to stopping the ball (very difficult on a sloping playground). We then progressed to passing the ball to each other using push passes and short-distance hits. We are loving the new skills we are learning – even though some of us seem to think that we are playing golf!

Let's hope the weather stays bright each Tuesday and we might even move on to dribbling and tackling – lots more skills to learn before we can venture to have a proper game.






Together we can!

In Cherwell we have been working hard on our place value, using three digit numbers. We have been counting up and down in hundreds and up and down in tens. We are also working hard at setting out our work and showing our reasoning. Great work this week Cherwell!

We have also begun our innovated version of Stone Age Boy. So far, we have written a great opening paragraph, choosing ambitious adjectives, and a build-up paragraph where our character finds that they have travelled back in time to the Stone Age. The children have been choosing a great range of vocabulary, and magpie-ing ideas, including adverbs such as Trepidatiously! We are a class of super story tellers!





We went on our first Year 1 trip on Monday to Birdland to see the dinosaurs. We had great time searching for the dinosaurs, trying out dinosaur footprints for size and being paleontologists. We also impressed our zookeeper with all the dinosaur facts we have been learning at school!







Safeguarding

How do children learn about safeguarding in school?

It's absolutely vital that our children in school understand what it is to safeguard ourselves and one another.

The first Safeguarding Assembly of the term was all about keeping safe at playtimes. Children learned and/or reminded about...

- ✓ Only using the Trim Track during school time (NOT before and after school) when it's supervised by staff;
- ✓ Only using the Trim Track when it's your turn and when it's dry;
- ✓ Taking it in turns (using the rota) to use the football/basketball court;
- ✓ Only using balls from school as they are slightly softer;
- ✓ Stacking no more than three tyres on top of one another OR, for our younger children, not above waist height;
- ✓ Making dens if tarpaulin/cloth is tied securely up and not in the bush by the lower gates;
- ✓ Wearing a helmet when using a scooter or trike;
- ✓ Areas that are out-of-bounds without permission, e.g. Forest School;
- ✓ Wearing wellies in the sandpit and on the grass through Autumn and Winter;
- ✓ When we hear the whistle, we stop, tidy up and line up.

We also ensure that children understand why we have our three rules in school...



These rules are essential in keeping everyone safe because:

- ✓ We feel important and happy;
- ✓ We are not hurting others and we know that we won't be hurt;
- ✓ We are helping others and know we'll be helped if we need it;
- ✓ We are listening and following instructions;
- ✓ We are speaking up for ourselves and know we're being listened to;
- ✓ We say sorry if we've made a mistake and we learn from our mistakes;
- ✓ We keep our belongings safe and tidy, our corridors clear and our cloakrooms organised;
- ✓ We are ready to learn everyone here is entitled to learn!
