Dear Families,

This term has flown by and so much has been achieved by our children. We talk about achieving great things in a great way and there is plenty of evidence of this. All children have had some great experiences, be that visitors coming into school for Mayan and Roman days, exciting visits to museums and railway stations, meeting and working with esteemed authors at the Literature festival and much more.

We have completed lesson observations and book looks across the school and we are really pleased with the standard of teaching and learning. Our children are attentive and engaged in their learning, and they work hard on challenging tasks and activities. There is a lot work in our children's books – focusing on fewer things in greater depth is allowing children to answer complex questions. In addition to this, through pupil voice, children are able to tell us about their learning which is not necessarily in a work book. For example, I took the Y2 class last week and spent half an hour talking with them about Windrush and Floella Benjamin; their knowledge and understanding was great, recalling fact and stating opinions about their leading question.

We have had several concerning messages from parents about dangerous parking. I have witnessed cars parking up in the middle of roads and being left. This message is relayed to us constantly and although, at school, we can do very little about it we must make people aware that this is such a danger to our children. I feel this is an accident waiting to happen – we are all parents and no-one wants our child to be in an accident on the road. Can people please be more mindful of what they are doing. No-one is more important than anyone else, we are all busy people and we all want our children kept safe. The Church carpark is always available - please use this. Thank you to those people who always park safely or park away and walk in.

Thank you everyone for your contributions for Harvest Festival, these will be donated to a local foodbank. Mrs Hudson commented on how lovely the KS1 assembly was and Harvest at Church was a super event too. We have been so impressed with the Creative Homework, we can see that you as parents and your children have thoroughly enjoyed this! We finished this term and today with a Y5 family assembly and Y1 Dinosaur Museum in school – both attended very well and lots of positive comments form parents.




Together we can!

Safeguarding

DOCUMENTO DE LA COMPASS

Operation Encompass is a national scheme that operates jointly between schools and all police forces.

Children who live in homes where there is domestic abuse, or who experience domestic abuse in their own teenage relationships, can be negatively impacted by this experience.

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We have ensured that a member of our staff, (Designated Safeguarding Lead) known as a Key Adult, has been trained about Operation Encompass procedures. This allows us to use the information that has been confidentially shared with us by the police, to understand how a child may be impacted by domestic abuse and to then offer support to the child/ren in our care.

This information means that we can understand a child's behaviour and support that child in whatever way they may need or want. P

Children who experience domestic abuse are recognised as victims of domestic abuse in their own right!

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Operation Encompass means that our school will be told, prior to the start of the next school day, when police have attended an incident of domestic abuse where there is a child or young person who attends our school who is related to any of those involved in the incident.

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We are keen to offer the very best support possible to all our pupils and we believe that being part of Operation Encompass helps us to do this.
