Dear Families,

All children have settled into the new term well and lots of new learning has taken place this week as we start our over-arching theme "We are Scientists" For 4 weeks our children will be immersed in lots of science knowledge and understanding and also technical and scientific drawings. Later this term - 13th December we have an open afternoon from 2:30-3:00pm where you will be able to view their amazing work. Y5 children are having some of their science lessons delivered through Cheltenham Preparatory School, teachers have reported that the children have thoroughly enjoyed these sessions, wearing goggles and lab coats in real science labs!

Our INSET day this week was spent on further refining our maths and writing approaches. Steve Lomax form Baccaras School and CanDo maths continued our training on maths on track meetings. These 15-minute sessions every day are in addition to the main maths session where children explore any misconceptions, have more opportunity to practice tricky elements of learning, revise timetables and deepen understanding. The afternoon was spent refining our talk for writing processes, including grammar. These sessions were delivered by me and Mrs Morrish, our English lead.

Separate to this newsletter, you will receive further information on the parent's questionnaires. As SLT we have looked at anything that fell below 70% and then explained what we are already doing and what more we think can be achieved. We are then going to send out an Office 365 form to gain your views. The questionnaire is a good starting point but it does require additional information to help us further review and improve. I hope many of you respond to the additional questions and I would like to emphasise that this is not a box ticking exercise, we really do think deeply about what more we can do.


Safeguarding

Teaching children about safeguarding

We regularly review our approach to the teaching and learning of safeguarding throughout the curriculum. Details of our offer are summarised on our school's website here: Naunton Park Primary School - Safeguarding in the curriculum

Teaching children about how to keep themselves and others safe, at an appropriate level for their age and stage in education, is a priority throughout the curriculum and wider offer.

This week, for example, Coram Education (through Gloucestershire Healthy Living and Learning's Life Education programme) have started to deliver a series of sessions to children across the school to "help children make healthy choices." Some Year 6 children have also completed their Bikeability Level 2 training this week, learning how to keep safe when riding a bike on the road. Children in Years 1-6 who did not have a Life Education session this week will have their's next week, and Avon Class will be completing their Bikeability next week too.



Next week, we will be recognising "Anti-bullying Week". Children across the school will be reading, and learning from, Cloud Busting by Malorie Blackman.

Our PSHE curriculum, planned and delivered using Jigsaw, equips children with the knowledge necessary to achieve the National Curriculum objectives for PSHE but also ensures children gain essential knowledge and skills to confidently move through their next stage in education and equip them for life in and out of school. Jigsaw is split into 6 units, each unit of which is studied each term from Reception to Year 6.



The 6 units for learning are:

- Being Me in My World
- Celebrating Difference
- Dreams and Goals
- Healthy Me
- Relationships
- · Changing Me

Additionally, beyond formal lesson time, teachers provide opportunities for children to reflect on their own wellbeing, mental and physical health. OPAL provides a time for children to develop skills for working and playing safely with others, while learning about boundaries and managing risk. Daily 'check ins' by teachers and teaching partners (every morning and after every playtime) provides time and opportunity to build relationships and monitor pupils' wellbeing at set times throughout the school day.








Together we can!

This week in Cherwell we have been busy learning the model text for our English unit on Biography. We are putting Talk 4 Writing actions to a text about Marcus Rashford. And we are very lucky to have Mrs Lewis in our class as she has drawn us this wonderful text map to help us remember the order of events.



We also had an exciting visit from the Life Education Bus and Harold the Giraffe. We learnt about how our brain sends messages to the rest of the body, and we learnt some tactics for being calm and for practising mindfulness. We also talked about how learning new things can take time and patience. So instead of saying 'I can't do it' we know to say: 'I can't do it YET!'





And in one final piece of news, we came back from half-term to find lovely new book shelves in our classroom. We are using these to display some of our new Leading Literature books — books we can use to help us answer our big question: What lies beneath our feet?

Hi Charlotte So lovely to get your email.




