With the festive season upon us it has started to feel very Christmassy at school. This week, as a Naunton Park tradition each class has a tree to decorate for outside their classrooms. Our governors at school have different ways they hold the school to account and support school improvement. The main items discussed were the curriculum and premises updates which are all very positive. We now have a standing item about sustainability and it was great to hear how much the eco-warriors made at the Christmas fair to further their work in the school community.

As a governing board we would like to thank all the staff at Naunton Park for their hard work and dedication this year. We would like to wish the whole school community a safe, restful and happy holiday break.


Class - Windrush

These are photos of our working wall.




Class – Severn

Yellow Class



RE – Why does Christmas matter to Christians?

This week in RE, we have been beginning to answer the question: Why does Christmas matter to Christians? Over the past couple of days, we have explored the importance of 'advent' to Christians and have learned about the meaning of the candles and the advent wreath itself. Then we explored what Christians believe the 'Good News' is about the Christmas story and how this helps them to lives their lives all year through.




During the week, we have also learned about the word 'incarnation'.

The children have learned that Christians believe that baby Jesus was no ordinary baby, but God on Earth.

They also know that the meaning of 'incarnation' literally means, 'God in the flesh' – and that Christians believe that God came to Earth (as Jesus) to live among ordinary people as a human himself, to help teach everyone how to live their lives.

Year 4 have been lucky enough to be visited by an anaesthetist and a surgeon this afternoon! Marius & Maddie Tulbure came in and spoke to Year 4 all about what happens to food inside our bodies! It was fascinating and we impressed them with everything we knew so far but loved finding out new things too, like we can last without air for 3 minutes, water for 3 days and food for 3 weeks! Statistics in the UK show that pupils who performed better at the end of primary and secondary school missed fewer days of school than those who did not perform so well. In 2019, 84% of Year 6 pupils who had 100% attendance achieved the expected standard at the end of primary school, compared to 40% of pupils who were persistently absent.
