

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Art Week

It's always lovely to kick start a term with an Art Week. This year of our cyclic programme focuses on printing and textiles. The children are really getting an opportunity to learn more focused and challenging skills with our new curriculum and this week saw the children tackling designing and making printing tiles using different materials, creating repeated patterns and experimenting with sewing and textiles.

Nick Heap, local artist, worked with Reception, Year 1, 2 and 3. Red and Green classes helped Nick to create a snowman scene printing tile and observed the printing process using ink and rollers, then they asked him questions. Years 1, 2 and 3 each made their own snowy post box scene being guided by Nick to scrape into the polystyrene and remove certain areas completely so that when they printed with ink, there were areas left perfectly white for the snow. The children worked brilliantly, listening carefully and creating beautiful art work as a result. Nick said "I had a fab time and absolutely loved working with all the children. Without exception, the ones I interacted with were enthusiastic, charming and engaged."

We look forward to Nick returning to work with Year 4 and 5 later in the term. Mrs Martin




Class – Avon

In our Computing lesson this week, we started leant how to use MicroBits. These are tiny computers that help the children learn to code and create with technology. It has many features including an LED display, input buttons and a motion sensor. We learnt how to write an algorithm that told the MicroBit to display our name and then we explored what else we could show using the LEDs.







Sherborne

In Sherborne this week we have been getting back into the swing of writing. We have had a go at writing spine poems, using our fantastic vocabulary to create a poem about what we would see in a magical factory. We created impossible inventions like suits of chocolate armour, and emerald green electricity bikes.



Class – Frome

Year 5 have loved art week. We have experimented with a few different types of mono-prints. Firstly, we colour mixed and covered an artist's palette with the paint before 'sketching' leaves using q-tips and printing this onto paper. Once these were dry we cut and arranged these in our books. Today, we have concentrated on nature printing, using water colours to imprint the outlines of leaves onto a colour washed background, and finally printing directly from the leaves onto paper. This will all feed into our final piece of textile artwork creating a printed rainforest which we will embellish using various stitches, inspired by Kim McCormack.



Safeguarding

Keeping safe at lunchtimes

We have included information in Park Life previously about how we teach the children to play safely at playtimes. This week, the children received an assembly to remind them about how to keep themselves and each other safe at lunchtimes. Please chat through this with your child at home to reiterate our messages in school. Thank you.

Children were reminded about the 'safe' adults in school to go to with any questions or worries...



We ask that children put rubbish and left-overs in the bin, cutlery in the water tray and cups in the bucket. This not only teaches the children to keep the eating area clean and tidy, but it also allows the adults to supervise and support children in their play.



The adults finish tidying and cleaning the canteen once all the children have returned to class.



We have a lot of equipment for children to play with. Long objects must be dragged along the floor and not be waved around in the air. Equipment is used to play with and, like hands/feet, mustn't be used to touch anyone with. Children love the long tubes to jump over!

The children are really helpful by putting everything back in its place at the end.



We talked about the importance of showing an adult what's been eaten before putting lunch away/in the bin. This is so that adults can check what each child has eaten and parents can be informed if children are not enjoying or eating enough food.

Children are asked to put their hand up to show what's left before packing away.

Children must always sit down while they're eating. We encourage the children to enjoy their eating time while chatting to their friends. Children can choose to eat outside or inside, but must always sit down to eat.





It's incredibly important that children listen to the adults on duty and listen to their instructions. The bell sounds each time a class can collect their lunch. The whistles signal the end of playtime. When children hear the whistle, they tidy up and line up calmly ready to start their afternoon lessons.
