

Class – Thames

A few weeks ago, we shared in the newsletter our session with local artist Nick Heap. He helped us to design and begin our linocut printing tiles. After what felt like hours and hours of painstaking carving using sharp tools, our water themed tiles were ready for printing. We used ink and rollers to transfer our designs onto cartridge paper and carefully peeled back our tiles in anticipation to see the finished results. 





Cherwell
