Wye








Class - Yellow

Science

This week we have been looking at how animals are suited to their environments. In particular, we have looked at animals that are native to Ghana and have explore the habitats that Ghana offers its wildlife.

We looked closely at the Mona monkey and the pangolin (one of the world's strangest creatures). It was fun to look at their particular features and how these features have helped them to suit the habitat in which they live.

"A pangolin's tongue is useful, because it can stick to ants."

"A Mona monkey's tail is useful, because it can be used for jumping and balancing."

"A pangolin's sharp claws are useful for digging to find ants to eat and for protecting it from predators.""

"A pangolin's scales are useful, so it can protect itself."

Features of a pangolin:


- Thick scales

- Sharp front claws.


Features of a Mona monkey:


- Long tail.

What is the male name for a badger?


What is the name for an otter's home?
