## Class News

#### Sherbourne

In Sherborne this week we had our last session with the young sports leaders from Cheltenham collage. Over the last few weeks they have come in and shared their knowledge with us, teaching us skills and rules of games to be able to successfully play matches successfully. They were very helpful and the children warmed to them all very quickly. Here are some of the shots from our final session.



### Class - Severn

This week, Year 5 were practicing learning to sew both back and running stitch. They learnt to thread a needle, tie knots and work with the fabric. They practiced by creating a leaf shape using back stitch for the outline and running stitch for the detail of the veins. We learnt it can be tricky but a bit of patience and perseverance helped us all to learn this great skill.









#### Green

Green Class have learnt to draw around a template, cut it out, draw on it with wax crayon, paint it with ink and add tentacles. As part of this skills teach, we now know to hold the template still with one hand whilst pushing hard against the template with the pencil hand. Cut slowly with the scissors, especially the wobbly bits at the bottom. Draw features and patterns with wax crayon. When the ink layer is added the wax resists the ink, so you can still see it. We used glue or tape to fix on the tentacles. They look good.

## Class – Wye

This week in Year 4, we tried out a new way to practise our times tables. The children worked as a team to play a game of dominoes with a times table twist. They were really engaged with this task and worked hard to match as many dominoes as they could using their times table knowledge.

### **OPAL Update**




