Now that arrangements have been finalised, we are delighted to tell you about the visits that we have arranged to enrich our curriculum in Terms 1 and 2.

Cheltenham Literature Festival

- Friday 11th October
- Montpellier Gardens, Cheltenham
- Event start time 10:15 am
- School uniform must be worn
- A jacket/coat should be worn
- Children will be walking to/from the festival
- No packed lunch needed as we will return to school in time for lunch.

This experience will promote reading for enjoyment for the children. We will be listening to the author Onjali Rauf talk about her new book: The Letter with the Golden Stamp.

World War 2 Evacuation Experience

- Thursday 26th September
- Winchcombe Railway Station, GL54 5LD
- Start time at venue 9:30am
- Finish time at venue 2:00pm
- Children should dress up in WW2-style clothing and bring a pillow case or suitcase containing their lunch
- Children will need to take a packed lunch and drink for the day – we ask that, if possible, this is a 1940s-style picnic lunch

This immersive experience links with our history topic of World War 2. The children will have a steam train journey 'to the safety of the countryside' (taking a round-trip from Winchcombe station), experience an 'air raid', listen to a talk from a real WW2 evacuee and take part in a 1930s/40s firefighting practice.

Macbeth Workshop

- Young Shakespeare Company

Four Young Shakespeare Company actors perform Shakespeare's mesmerizing story of ambition, guilt and revenge in a fast-moving fully-costumed interactive production. The play is brought vividly to life around and among the children, at times including the whole audience to create such dramatic scenes as the meeting between Macbeth and the witches, the royal banquet at which Macbeth sees Banquo's ghost and the thrilling battle in which Macbeth comes face to face with his greatest enemy Macduff. Throughout the performance the storyteller enables the children to become actively involved in the play through a carefully structured range of drama and language activities. Volunteers from among the children are also chosen to become individual characters in the story and all the children have the opportunity to speak and enjoy Shakespeare's words in short, accessible sections. Payment

The school invites you to make a voluntary contribution of £33.60 to cover the cost of all of the above activities and coach travel to/from Winchcombe. No child will be prevented from going on these visits because their parents do not pay but we must point out that the visit may have to be cancelled if we do not receive sufficient contributions. **All contributions should be made via the ParentPay website by Friday 20th September.** If you are experiencing difficulty, please contact the school office.

Permission and help

Permission is assumed when you make your contribution for your child's trip. You only need to email us if you're either unable to make a voluntary contribution but give permission for your child to attend, if your child receives Pupil Premium funding (see below) or if you are able to help on the trip.
