### Terms 1-2 trips for Year 6

Dear Parents,

Now that arrangements have been finalised, we are delighted to tell you about the visit that we have arranged to enrich our curriculum in Terms 1 and 2.

#### Cheltenham Literature Festival

- Monday 13<sup>th</sup> October
- Montpellier Gardens, Cheltenham
- Event start time 10:10 am
- School uniform must be worn
- A jacket/coat should be worn
- Children will be walking to/from the festival
- No packed lunch needed as we will return to school in time for lunch.

This experience will promote reading for enjoyment for the children. We will be listening to the author Ross Montgomery talk about his new book: I am Rebel.

#### World War 2 Evacuation Experience

- Thursday 25<sup>th</sup> September
- Winchcombe Railway Station, GL54 5LD
- Start time at venue 9:30am
- Finish time at venue 2:00pm
- Children should dress up in WW2-style clothing and bring a pillow case or suitcase containing their lunch
- Children will need to take a packed lunch and drink for the day – we ask that, if possible, this is a 1940s-style picnic lunch

This immersive experience links with our history topic of World War 2. The children will have a steam train journey 'to the safety of the countryside' (taking a round-trip from Winchcombe station), experience an 'air raid', listen to a talk from a real WW2 evacuee and take part in a 1930s/40s firefighting practice.

#### Macbeth Workshop

- In school
- 20<sup>th</sup> and 21<sup>st</sup> October (one day per class)
- Play in a Day workshops

Play in a Day play workshops are an interactive way of encouraging learning and creativity. One of the Play in a Day facilitators will work with one class throughout the day, using different drama techniques and exercises. The day accumulates in the pupils sharing a short performance to an audience. This performance will showcase what they have learnt throughout the day and show the remarkable confidence this workshop brings.

The way in which Play in a Day is designed allows for everyone's voice to be heard. All pupils will be involved in their own way and will be encouraged to share their talents and work as a group to support each other.



This is a great opportunity for the children to become familiar with the story of Macbeth and Shakespeare's writing in general. It will be an exciting introduction to our English work that will following on from the performance and will provide them with a opportunity to perform in front of an audience.

### **Payment**

**The school invites you to make a voluntary contribution of £39.50** to cover the cost of all of the above activities and coach travel to/from Winchcombe. No child will be prevented from going on these visits because their parents do not pay but we must point out that the visit may have to be cancelled if we do not receive sufficient contributions. **All contributions should be made via the ParentPay website by Friday 19<sup>th</sup> September.** If you are experiencing difficulty, please contact the school office.

### **Permission and help**

Permission is assumed when you make your contribution for your child's trip. You only need to email us if you're either unable to make a voluntary contribution but give permission for your child to attend, if your child receives Pupil Premium funding (see below) or if you are able to help on the trip.
